ORBIT INTERNATIONAL'S POWER UNIT SEGMENT  
RECEIVES OVER \$750,000 IN NEW ORDERS

Potential for Multi-Year Requirement Could Exceed \$3.5 Million

Commercial Division Backlog At Its Highest Level Since 1996

Hauppauge, New York, January 22, 2004—Orbit International Corp. (NASDAQ:ORBT) today announced that the commercial division of its Power Units Segment, Behlman Electronics, Inc., (“Behlman”) has received an order for 100 units, totaling \$660,000, for a power supply to be used in a hydraulic test system for the U.S. Air Force. Deliveries under this contract are expected to commence in the third quarter of 2004 and continue through the first quarter of 2005.

Behlman received an initial prototype award under this program for four units in April 2002 and qualification testing was completed in August 2003. This order represents the initial production award for this power supply and if option quantities are exercised by the U.S. Air Force, production orders could continue through 2007 totaling in excess of \$3,500,000.

In addition, the Company reported that Behlman's commercial division received two additional orders totaling approximately \$110,000. These orders were for power supplies used in the oil exploration industry and for frequency converters used by the U.S. Air Force for mobile power requirements. The order for the oil services power supply brings the total bookings for this unit during the past year to approximately \$400,000.

Dennis Sunshine, President and CEO of Orbit, commented, “The receipt of these orders affirms our belief that Behlman's business model, which emphasizes flexible designs and superior customer service, will continue to lead to future business opportunities. We are excited about this new order that will be used in a hydraulic test system for the U.S. Air Force and we are encouraged by the future business potential that it may bring.”

Sunshine added, “Behlman's commercial division, which had reported weakness in 2002 and early in 2003, primarily due to weak economic conditions, continues to book new business and we are pleased to report that the backlog of this division is at its highest level since 1996. With continued business from its custom division, we are confident that our Power Units Segment will continue to grow in 2004.”

Orbit International Corp., based in Hauppauge, New York, is involved in the manufacture of customized electronic components and subsystems for military and nonmilitary government applications. Its Behlman Electronics, Inc. subsidiary manufactures and sells high quality commercial power units, AC power sources, frequency converters, inverters,

uninterruptible power supplies and associated analytical equipment. The Behlman custom division designs, manufactures and sells power units and electronic products for military and high-end industrial usage.
